

## AP Breadth Assignments

Choose one for each breadth portfolio piece, or come up with your own idea.

Remember to focus on one or more of the **Principles of Design** in each project:

- Unity/Variety
- Balance/Emphasis/Contrast
- Rhythm
- Repetition
- Proportion/Scale
- Figure-Ground Relationships

Think a lot about your possibilities for surface decoration:

TEXTURE:

Additive  
Incised  
Impressed

GLAZING:

Stains  
Underglaze crayons or pencils  
Sgraffito  
etc.

### Wheel-Thrown

Set of 3 lidded canisters, progressive in size, smallest one at least 5" wide, with thrown fitted lids  
Large platters, showing texture, pattern, or interesting glazing  
Large nesting bowls (at least 3) – tall mixing bowls, or shorter serving bowls, with wide lip  
Large Pitcher and 4 matching cups/mugs (make at least 6 mugs so you can get four that match well)  
Teapot and four matching teacups  
Set of three BOTTLE forms at least 10" each  
LARGE piece – minimum 18" tall  
Large floor pot – minimum 24" tall  
Set of 5 mugs with pulled handles  
Pitcher with matching goblets  
Place setting for four – Dinner plates, Salad plates  
Casserole with lid and handles  
Large sectional, at least 24" tall, made by combining wheel thrown pieces  
Set of vases – at least 8" tall each

### Wheel/Hand-built Combo

Slab-built bottle, at least 10 inches tall, with several identical thrown spouts - may also have decorative handles.  
Animal sculpture made from one or more thrown pots and decorated with added clay.  
Two large (at least 12" across) bowls made by draping over slump mold, with thrown foot.  
Set of two large planters (wheel or hand-built) and attach tall pedestal feet (at least 6" high)

### Hand-built

Slab building structure that is at least 14 inches tall  
Using curved slabs, create an ark or shrine sculpture that is at least 15" tall or wide  
Figure sculpture: entire body, bust, or just head  
Large mask, at least 14" tall
